## *Instructions for Poster Session Entries (Open to County faculty members only)*

**The FSHS and SCSSF will meet jointly** at the Plantation Golf Resort and Spa in Crystal River, FL (<http://www.plantationgolfandspa.com/>). This year's meeting will offer many opportunities for all attending. In addition to over 170 technical presentations, there will be two evening receptions to get together with friends and colleagues, and special sessions with invited speakers. Located on the gulf coast of Florida on Kings Bay, this classical hotel surrounded by 232 acres of picturesque country side with rolling greens, and grand live oaks, palms and pines, truly embodies the meaning of "Southern Hospitality".

**The Joint Meeting of FSHS and SCSSF** will feature presentations of applied research pertaining to horticultural and agronomic crops and products, and new developments and practices that have been put into use by growers, processors, allied industries, and other horticultural interests in Florida. Growers, processors

and those in allied industries are encouraged to present papers. The meeting will again feature two FSHS student competitions: a **Student Best Oral Presentation Competition** and a **Student Best Paper Competition**. SCSSF will also sponsor Student Competitions. New this year will be a **County Faculty Poster Session**.

This year again, the 2010 FSHS meeting has been approved as an **in-service training**. In addition, there will also be a combined in-service training on the afternoon of Tuesday June 8 (co-sponsored by the fruit and vegetable, citrus, small farms, ornamentals and turf focus teams) entitled “**Marketing value-added horticultural commodities economically and safely**” (Amy Simonne, organizer). County faculty and specialist will soon be able to sign up for this program at the Program Development Center and Evaluation web site (<http://pdec.ifas.ufl.edu>) under program ID 29144. Space is limited, so sign early! As always, by officially signing for this program, approved participants will have their travel, registration and lodging costs covered by UF Extension Administration. People Soft codes for travel request and approval will be available from the pdec sign-up page at a later date.

New this year: FSHS will host a **County Faculty Poster Session** (Senior and presenting author must be a County faculty member attending the meeting). This new session is intended to become a forum for Extension faculty who work with horticultural producers and consumers to share ideas on extension programming. County faculty with programmatic responsibilities in Horticulture, Agriculture, and Family and Consumer Sciences are encouraged to submit entries provided the topic of the poster involves horticultural commodities. To enter the session, authors should submit a 300-word abstract (similar to the abstract submitted for oral presentations) to the corresponding sectional Vice-President clearly indicating “Poster Session Entry”. Posters should present **an Extension program** following the format: title, author(s), affiliation, introduction/background, problem faced by the target audience, objectives and educational approach, teaching(s) offered, curriculum used, outcomes and impacts, and pros and cons in adopting this program in another county. Posters must be self-standing (hard back; size not to exceed 4-ft wide x 3-ft tall) and set up will be on Sunday June 6 between 3:00 and 5:00 pm, and poster must be removed by Tuesday, June 8 at 12:30 p.m. Interaction/discussion between meeting audience and authors will be facilitated during a poster session on Monday June 7 between 7:30 and 8:30am in the continental breakfast area. Poster session will be coordinated by Brad Burbaugh. Opportunity for publication of the poster in the proceedings in the form of an expanded abstract (1 page of text and 1 page of tables, figures or pictures) will also be available. Note that FSHS publications allow for links to videos. Contact your sectional VP for more information.

**Authors in good standing** with FSHS are encouraged to submit **abstract titles to section-VPs on Feb 19, 2010**. The list of titles is used for advertising the meeting. **Abstracts are due by March 16 to the respective society sections’ vice presidents** and will be published on the FSHS web site (<http://www.fshs.org>). See instructions for each society section below. Papers presented through FSHS and SCSSF at the Annual Meeting will be published in the Proceedings of the FSHS and SCSSF separately; manuscripts are due at the time of the presentation for FSHS. The end of the grace period for late manuscripts corresponding to talks given at FSHS is June 22, 2010.
